Presidential Scholars Competition

Harden Scholarships (20 awards of four-year tuition, room and board) and other scholarships ranging from \$500-\$2000 per year. Students receive a variety of scholarships from this competition. Held in November for high school seniors who will be new freshmen in the fall. To compete, applicants must be admitted to NMU and have a HS GPA of 3.5 or higher and an ACT/SAT of 24/1090 or higher (excluding writing). First Year Experience Program

All first-time, full-time freshman participate in NMU's First Year Experience (FYE) program. FYE's major-specific "block" scheduling provides students with a learning community experience that maximizes academic success in the first year. Opportunity for academically-talented students to enroll in a challenging sequence of classes taught by highly skilled faculty, culminating in the Senior Capstone Experience (HS GPA 3.5+, ACT 27+). nmu.edu/honors

Admission Requirements

Rolling admission. Application fee: \$35.00. Students may apply on-line.

NMU provides a wide range of educational opportunities and therefore has a wide range of admission requirements. Details about admissions policies for various academic programs and student applicant types can be found online at nmu.edu/apply or nmu.edu/catalog. Each applicant's materials are reviewed individually. Applicants who do not meet all criteria will be fully considered by the Admissions Review Committee.

Notes:

- GPA Calculation: NMU will use the cumulative GPA reported on the high school transcript. If a high school computes more than one GPA (e.g. weighted and unweighted), NMU will use the higher of the two.
- Test Scores: ACT or SAT are required. Test scores are accepted from testing agency or affixed to an official high school transcript. Writing tests not required, but school of education applicants are encouraged to take the writing test.
- Advanced Placement, CLEP and International Baccalaureate: Students achieving a passing score receive credit for equivalent NMU courses.

Housing

Residence hall students enjoy a strong, friendly community rich with opportunities for personal growth, involvement, and connection with other aspects of campus life. NMU has ten three-story residence halls which house a total of 2,609 students. Three of these have been LEED certified by the U.S Green Building Council. Most students live in "suites" consisting of two-person rooms, connected by a shared bathroom.

All single undergraduate students under the age of 21 who are not living at home with their parents within 60 miles of campus must live in a residence hall for four semesters or until they've earned 56 credits. The residence hall room contract, signed at check-in, is for the academic year. The University also has 356 apartments for single students and student families. Eighty-five of those apartments are designated specifically for single students.

Vehicles are permitted on campus for all students.
