In recognition of his distinguished career as a nationally renowned architect, lecturer, and teacher.

As a professional architect of the highest order, he has designed hundreds of schools, commercial and residential buildings. Among the more publicized include a laboratory building for the University of Hawaii - Hilo Campus, comedian Bob Hope's home in Palm Springs, California and the radio-astronomy laboratory for the California Institute of Technology.

He spent six years as Teliesin Fellow working under architect Frank Lloyd Wright and served as architect's superintendent on four of Wright's projects.

A highly sought lecturer and teacher, he has spent considerable time with architectural and art students at many west coast schools. A traveling exhibit of his works is currently on a world-wide tour.

He has been made a Fellow in the American Institute of Architects for "Excellence in Design." This is the highest honor which one can receive from the American Institute of Architects.

A highly motivated and dedicated individual, he has brought honor and integrity to his Alma Mater through his outstanding performances in the field of architecture.
