



AN INTRODUCTION TO BARAGA COUNTY

Beginning in the seventeenth century French voyageurs, trappers, and missionaries camped in the vicinity of L'Anse at the bottom of Keweenaw Bay. Later in 1831 the Slovenian-born, Father Frederic Baraga established a mission at Zeba and then moved it across the bay to Assinins. The county was established in 1875.

The area was well wooded and timber was the basis for the local economy. Numerous immigrants were attracted to the county to work in the woods. In the 20th century Norwegians moved to the sawmill town of Pequaming where in the late 1930s a few Norwegian customs survived. Rye bread was popular along the lutefisk. "Frenchtown" in the north section of the town became home to Finns after 1900 and became known as "Finntown."

The town of Skanee, named after an area in Sweden was first settled by fishermen who fished the waters of Huron Bay. Then the area was homesteaded by Swedish lumbermen who turned to farming. In the 1930s hundreds of bushels of apples and potatoes were shipped from the area. These Swedish and Finnish farmers also were fine dairy farmers. The ghost-town of Arvon, home to slate quarries was named after a Welsh community.
