Science Olympiad is an educational program which takes the form of a team competition that consists of 23 team events. The events are rotated to reflect the ever-changing nature of life, personal, and social science, earth and space science, physical science and chemistry, technology and engineering, and inquiry and nature of science. The program is designed to increase student interest and test scores in science, while strengthening problem solving and teamwork skills. It encourages students to consider science-based careers and allows them to explore that possibility before making a choice for college.
