LPN to BSN Track Admission Requirements and Procedures

LPN-BSN Nursing Students

Once you are admitted to Northern Michigan University, you will indicate that you wish to pursue a BSN degree in nursing by declaring nursing as your major and you are considered a pre-nursing student. Students declaring nursing as a major are assigned an adviser from the School of Nursing and with their adviser plan the academic program to complete the required courses. When the student is nearing completion of the prerequisites, and in consultation with her/his adviser, the student may apply for admission to the nursing sequence.

The LPN to BSN track is completed on a full-time schedule. Nursing courses are usually offered during fall and winter semesters. Non-nursing courses may also be offered during spring or summer semesters. An adviser from the School of Nursing will assist the student in developing an academic program plan to complete the required courses. Admission to the University does <u>not</u> guarantee entry to the nursing program.

LPN to BSN Track: Application and Admission Requirements

An adviser from the School of Nursing will assist the student in developing an academic program plan to complete the required courses. Applicants wishing to enter the LPN to BSN Track must complete the application online and submit it according to the required deadlines. Applications are available online one month prior to the deadline at nmu.edu/nursing/application.

Admission to the University does not guarantee admission to the BSN program.

LPN to BSN Track Application

Application Deadlines

Applications are completed and submitted online. Applications, including re-entry applications, are due by:

- o Fall Admission February 1st 11:59 PM Eastern Time
- Winter Admission October 1st 11:59 PM Eastern Time

Minimum Requirements

The School of Nursing Admission Committee reviews all applications. *Applications are considered for admission if the applicant meets the following minimum requirements:*

- Student is admitted to Northern Michigan University. Must have a current IN number.
- Nursing admission online application form is complete, and is received by the School of Nursing by the due date.
- Student has the minimum required GPA:
 - 2.75 for Traditional BSN Track and LPN to BSN Track
 - Applications with a GPA less than 2.75 will not be reviewed by the Admission Committee.
 - Post baccalaureate students: the post baccalaureate GPA will be used if <a>12 credits have been taken since graduation. Otherwise, the undergraduate GPA will be used.
- Students must have completed (with a C- or higher grade) <u>or</u> be currently enrolled in the eight (8) BSN prerequisite courses (or equivalent) when application is made to the BSN program (this must be clearly evident on the transcripts and TCE).
 - **NOTE: If a student currently has a grade below a C- in a prerequisite course, they must wait until the course is successfully repeated before applying.
- Students must achieve a minimum of a C- in each prerequisite course prior to starting their nursing coursework. Grid scores only reflect officially recorded grades after course completion. The <u>most recent</u> course grade is used for all purposes. NOTE: Nursing (NU) courses have a minimum passing grade of C.

Required BSN Prerequisite Courses

- BI 207 Anatomy and Physiology I (4 credits)*
 - BI 104 may be substituted
 - If more than one of these courses have been completed (BI104/BI201/BI207) the most recent course grade will be considered on the admission criteria scoring grid
- BI 208 Anatomy and Physiology II (4 credits)*
- BI 203A Medical Microbiology (3 credits) or BI 203 Medical Microbiology with lab (5 credits)
- CH 109 Introductory Organic and Biochemistry for the Health Sciences (SCII 4 credits)
 - CH 111 and CH 112 may be substituted
- AH 201/HN 301 A Nutrition for Health Professions I (2 credits)
- AH 202/HN 301 B Nutrition for Health Professions II (2 credits)
 - HN 210 may be accepted as AH 201 & AH 202 (HN 301A & HN 301B) only if taken at NMU and the student is practicing as an LPN. If taken elsewhere, HN 210 is equivalent to AH 201/HN 301A. AH 202/HN 301B must still be taken by the student.
- PSY 100 Introduction to Psychological Science (SCII 4 credits) or PSY 101 General Psychology (PERS - 3 credits)
 - See the General Education Components and consult with your adviser to determine which psychology course to take. Only one general psychology course can be counted.
- AH 102 Human Growth and Development (INTT-3 credits)

Transcripts:

If less than 12 credits have been earned at NMU, provide current transcripts of all courses taken at any college or university (unofficial transcripts accepted) and a Transfer Credit Evaluation (TCE), which is obtained from the NMU Registrar's Office.

College Board Advanced Placement Credit:

- For students with College Board Advanced Placement credit in Chemistry, the following grading system will be used to determine grades in chemistry on the SON Admission Grid: AP exam score of 5 points = A, 4 points = B+, and 3 points = C+. You will need to include a copy of your official scoring report from the College Board with your application.
- If you have received Advanced Placement course credit for courses not impacting the SON
 Admission Grid, you will need to provide copies of equivalency acceptance of these scores by the
 registrar at NMU. The NMU equivalency page provides information as to acceptable scores on
 each exam for NMU credit. (nmu.edu/bulletin/exam-equivalencies)

LPN Students only

Scan and attach a copy of current LPN license. The license must be unencumbered (have no restrictions/sanctions). Students wishing to apply for advanced placement credit for coursework must submit proof of passing the NCLEX-PN within the last 5 years or have worked as an LPN within the last 5 years.

Post-baccalaureate Students only

Students that have earned a bachelor's degree and are pursuing a second bachelor's degree in nursing should submit a Post-baccalaureate Check-list Form to the NMU Registrar's Office for completion. This form can be found at nmu.edu/nursing/applications and must be delivered to the School of Nursing, 2301 Weston Hall, in an envelope sealed by the NMU Registrar's Office.

LPN License

Students that have a LPN license must provide a copy of their LPN license with their application. The license must be unencumbered and have no restriction and/or sanctions. A license that is restricted or sanctioned is **not** considered an active license to practice and does **not** meet program requirements for entry or progression. This includes temporarily suspended licenses, revoked licenses and any other restrictions. It is strongly recommended that students carry their own malpractice insurance. Additional information regarding this policy is available through the Associate Dean/Director of the School of Nursing.

^{*}Students need to have a combination of BI 201 and BI 202 OR BI 207 and BI 208.

Ranking of Applications

The Admission Criteria Scoring Grid (page 10) will be used as the admission tool for the general program admission to determine each BSN cohort.

Students meeting the minimum requirements are ranked according to the Admission Criteria Scoring Grid score by the Admissions Committee. Students are notified by email and/or mail of their admission status.

Post-baccalaureate Students

Only students who can provide proof of an earned bachelor's degree at the time of admission to
the NMU BSN program receive 5 points on the admission scoring grid. Students graduating at the
end of the semester in which they apply to the NMU SON do NOT receive these 5 points. If a
student has earned 2 bachelor's degrees or a bachelor's and master's degree, a maximum of 5
points is awarded for these achievements.

PN Students

Students applying while still enrolled in a PN program do NOT receive credit on the scoring
admission grid for LPN status. Only PNs who have proof of passing their nursing licensure boards
at the time of admission to the NMU BSN program are awarded the 5 points on the scoring
admission grid.

Post-baccalaureate PN Students

Students that have BOTH a bachelor's/master's degree and a LPN license/degree receive a
 <u>maximum</u> of 5 points total in category III on the BSN admission scoring grid.

Admission to Program: Applicants who have met admission criteria and whose ranked Admission Criteria Scoring Grid Score falls within the number of available seats are <u>provisionally</u> admitted to the program until verification of the successful completion of all prerequisite courses and maintenance of the required minimal GPA is received. In the event that the final score using the Admission Criteria Scoring Grid results in a tie, student ranking will be determined by the students' overall GPA.

Waiting List: Applicants who meet all requirements for admission, but whose Admission Criteria Scoring Grid score is ranked one to ten positions lower than the number of seats available are placed on a waiting list that is ordered according to total score. The waiting list is maintained through the first week of classes the following semester. All other applicants are considered not admitted to the program. Applicants not admitted or waitlisted who still desire admission to the program must reapply for the next semester.

Applications from applicants who do not meet minimum admission criteria or whose application is incomplete are not reviewed by the admission committee.

Applicants will lose their provisional acceptance status if they:

- Do not complete all prerequisite course work with satisfactory grades (C- or higher).
 - NOTE: The most recent course grade is used for all purposes.
- Do not submit final grades from all prerequisite courses from other universities.
- Do not maintain the minimum required cumulative 2.75 GPA.
- Withdraw from the University.
- Do not submit notification of receipt of Criminal Background Check (CBC) by date specified in the provisional acceptance letter.
- Do not complete immunization/urine screening/CPR requirements as stated in provisional acceptance letter.
- Change in LPN licensure status.

The number of students who can be admitted to the nursing sequence during any semester is based on seat availability. The School of Nursing reserves the right to choose which applicants are admitted to the nursing program.

Applications are not saved after the beginning of a semester. Students must re-apply for every semester they wish to be considered for admission.

Transfer Credits

- Transfer students should ensure that all prerequisite courses taken at another institution have been transferred to Northern Michigan University and a Transfer Credit Evaluation (TCE) is completed by the NMU Registrar's Office. Obtaining a TCE from the Registrar's Office requires admission to the university and several weeks for completion.
- Students should upload a current unofficial transcript in their online application if currently enrolled in prerequisites at an institution other than Northern Michigan University.
- Students transferring to the NMU School of Nursing from another nursing program must provide proof of
 good standing from their previous program. Proof will be submitted to the Associate Dean/Director of the
 School of Nursing at the time of application to the NMU Nursing Program before admission to the NMU
 BSN Program will be considered.
- Post-Baccalaureate students seeking admission to the BSN Program should submit the Post-Baccalaureate
 Prerequisite Check List (available at nmu.edu/nursing/applications) to the NMU Registrar's Office. The
 completed form must be delivered to the School of Nursing via email from the Registrar's office or to
 2301 Weston Hall, in an envelope sealed by the Registrar's office.

Advanced Placement Credit for NU 211 and NU 212

LPN to BSN students have the same curriculum requirements as the Traditional BSN Track. LPN-BSN students may receive Advanced Placement Credit for two nursing courses (NU 211 and NU 212).

Credit by advanced placement is designed to recognize a person's previous educational and health experience with appropriate academic credit. Students qualify, *without testing*, for automatic Advanced Placement Credit for NU211 (4 credits), NU212 (3 credits) for a total of seven credits, if they meet one of the following requirements:

- Graduated from an LPN program and licensed within 5 years of admission into the BSN program.
- Worked as an LPN within 5 years of admission into the BSN program (documentation must be provided).
- Graduated from the NMU PN program but not yet licensed. This student will need to see his/her adviser for special course substitution paperwork.

Applicants who do not meet one of these requirements will be required to complete the above courses successfully as part of their curriculum requirements.

Pharmacology

LPN graduates who completed AH 107 at NMU and who hold a valid LPN license may substitute AH 107 Clinical Pharmacology for NU 221 Pharmacology I in the BSN program. A course substitution form will be completed by the School of Nursing if the LPN applicant is admitted to the BSN program.

Pharmacology courses at other institutions may be accepted. Please consult with your nursing faculty adviser.

<u>Criminal Background Checks (CBC)/Clinic Requirements</u>

Criminal background checks are required of all students admitted to any nursing program. It is the student's responsibility to know whether he or she is eligible for licensure. If you have been convicted of a crime, it is your responsibility to find out if your background will prohibit you from being licensed and to be employed in the health care industry. If you have any questions about your existing criminal background you should consult with legal counsel before applying to the nursing program.

In addition to criminal background checks, students must comply with all policies for clinical placement(s). This may include drug testing, immunization requirements and other health information the agency may require.

Transferring Credits

- Other Chemistry courses may be substituted for the NMU chemistry requirements at the discretion of the nursing faculty: Minimum of 4 semester credits of both organic and inorganic chemistry content.
- Other Microbiology courses may be substituted for the NMU microbiology requirements at the discretion of the nursing faculty: Minimum of 2 semester credits of Microbiology.
- Nutrition: AH 201 & AH 202 (or HN 301A & HN 301B). Nutrition courses transferring in from other colleges may transfer as HN 210 which is equivalent to AH 201/HN 301A. In that case, students will also need have the equivalent of AH 202/HN 301B.
- PY 1001 transfer credit is accepted for the psychology nursing prerequisite and credits apply in Component 6:
 Perspectives in Society.

Advanced Placement (AP) Test Scores

- Psychology The SON does accept Psychology Advanced Placement (score of 4 or better) for the psychology course prerequisite. This also satisfies one course of Component 6: Perspectives on Society.
- Chemistry Students must submit Advanced Placement Chemistry scores **only** if they are used in the BSN Scoring Grid Criteria point calculations. An AP Chemistry score will be scored as follows: 3 = C+, 4 = B+, 5 = A. No further chemistry is needed should the student wish to use this letter grade as their chemistry grade. However, if a student with Advanced Placement Chemistry credit for CH 111 takes CH 112 for a higher grade; the two grades (AP and CH 112) are averaged. Chemistry 109 grade stands alone, even if student has taken lower level Chemistry prior to CH 109 or has AP Chemistry credit.

Nursing Prerequisites & General Education requirements

- Enrollment in CH 109 New students who are eligible for CH 109 are those who 1) pass the math test at the MA 100 level, and 2) pass the chemistry proficiency test with 50% correct or demonstrate successful completion of a college chemistry course. If the student does not meet the requirements for CH 109, the student is to take CH 105, then CH 109. CH 111 & CH 112 may be substituted for CH 109.
- CH 109 satisfies 1 course (4 credits) of Component 7: Scientific Inquiry (SCII) and all of the lab requirement for graduation.
- AH 102 satisfies 3 credits of Component 4: Integrative Thinking (INTT).
- PSY 100 satisfies 1 course (4 credits) of Component 7: Scientific Inquiry (SCII) and all of the lab requirement for graduation. (formerly PY 100 Introduction to Psychology-4 cr.) at NMU. PSY 101 satisfies 1 course (3 credits) in Component 6: Perspectives in Society (PERS). Can only earn credit for one beginning psychology course.

NOTE: Any student interested in graduate school should consider taking a statistics course.

The General Education program began Fall 2017 at NMU. Courses meeting component requirements are evolving. Students are highly encouraged to check the General Education program website for updates: nmu.edu/bulletin/general-education

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Must all required prerequisite courses be completed before admission to the nursing sequence?

Students must have completed (with a C- or higher grade) <u>or</u>, if not completed, be currently enrolled in the required prerequisite courses or equivalent (see page 3) when application is made to the BSN program (this must be clearly evident on the transcripts and TCE). Students must achieve a minimum of a C- in each prerequisite course prior to starting their nursing coursework. Grid scores only reflect officially recorded grades after course completion. The <u>most recent</u> course grade is used for all purposes.

**NOTE: If a student currently has a grade below a C- in a prerequisite course, they must wait until the course is successfully repeated before applying.

2. Does a bachelor's degree or LPN license enhance an applicant's chances of being accepted?

Yes. Category III on the Admission Criteria Scoring Grid provides a maximum of five (5) additional points to students who have completed a bachelor's degree or are currently a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

3. How many times per year are students admitted to the BSN program?

Two. Fall and winter semesters.

4. Are letters of recommendation required?

No, but LPN students are required to submit a recent letter verifying employment with their application.

5. When will notification of acceptance or rejection be made?

Normally not later than the beginning of the registration period for the semester of application.

6. Who makes up the Admissions Committee?

School of Nursing faculty and the Associate Dean/Director.

7. What courses from other institutions will transfer?

All non-nursing college level courses from regionally accredited institutions with a C- or higher grade are usually accepted for transfer credit. Please contact the Office of Admissions for further information or see nmu.edu/transfer. Transfer of nursing courses requires specific approval from the School of Nursing.

8. Should a nursing student carry their own malpractice and health insurance?

The School of Nursing recommends it.
