We at the Department of Theatre and Dance believe that as a pre-professional training program, it is our responsibility to ensure that students' opportunities reflect what they will be getting once they enter the professional world. If you are interested in exploring technology and design for theatre and discovering all of the avenues that it can open for you in the world of theatre, television, and film, then the Theatre Technology and Design degree within NMU's Department of Theatre and Dance is the perfect program for you!

Additional Considerations

The BFA in Theatre Technology and Design is a highly specialized and sought after program of study. This degree offers 6 different areas of study - Scenery, Costumes, Lighting, Sound and Media, Stage Management, and Technical Direction. In most cases, students will be admitted into the program in their freshman year, but students may also audition for the BFA program in any year of study if they choose to do so. Admittance into the BFA program requires an interview and portfolio submission.

As we continue to see within our program, the job market for Theatre Technologists and Designers is vast and exciting. Furthermore, the training that the Department of Theatre and Dance offers its students prepares them for an abundant of careers.
