## HOW TO APPLY

**1 Complete this Application Form.**

**2 Submit the Application Fee.**  
Submit the \$35 non-refundable application processing fee in one of these ways:

- ▶ By credit card via phone at 906-227-2650 or 800-682-9797
- ▶ By check or money order made payable to NMU; please include the applicant's name on the check
- ▶ By cash at the Admissions Office, 2212 Hedgcock Building.

If you wish to enroll in a future term, you may apply your paid fee to any term occurring within one calendar year of your initial application. In cases of financial hardship, a fee waiver request may be made. NMU considers requests made via standard fee waiver request forms such as College Board, NACAC, or high school forms verifying financial status. These may be submitted via mail or fax (906-227-1747).

### **YOU DO NOT HAVE TO PAY THE FEE IF YOU ARE A:**

**Senior age 62 or older** who qualifies for the senior citizen tuition waiver.

**Former NMU student** who has previously attended NMU at the same level to which you are applying (an application fee is required only once for the undergraduate application and once for the post-baccalaureate/graduate school application).

**3 Submit Your Transcripts.**  
Request your official high school transcript or GED score report, and any college/university/trade school/military transcripts, be sent to the NMU Admissions Office. You must have an official transcript submitted directly from each institution you attended even if no credits were earned.

**If you are/were enrolled in college courses prior to high school graduation**, you must list that college on the application form. Please request that an official college transcript be sent directly to the NMU Admissions Office upon course completion. (If you took classes at NMU, you do not need to request a transcript.)

**Students who have attended other colleges** will find helpful information at [nmu.edu/transfer](http://nmu.edu/transfer).

**Re-entry students** need to supply transcripts from institutions attended since last attendance at NMU.

**Applicants who have completed post-secondary course work must submit all non-U.S., non-Canadian academic records** to an external agency for a credential evaluation. A "Course-by-Course" report --or equivalent-- must be selected. NMU uses the information on the report to help determine admissibility and any transfer of credit. Transcripts not issued in English must be accompanied by a same format, word-for-word English translation. Please contact the Admissions Office for information.

**YOU DO NOT HAVE TO SUBMIT TRANSCRIPTS IF YOU ARE A** non-degree applicant. Transfer applicants who have earned more than 12 college-level credits after high school and postbaccalaureate applicants are not required to submit high school transcripts.

**4 Submit Your Test Scores.**  
Request your ACT or SAT scores be sent to NMU. If you listed NMU when you registered for the test, the testing agency will send the results to us. The scores may also be on your official high school transcript, which will suffice. Otherwise, submit an online request at [act.org](http://act.org) or [sat.org](http://sat.org). **NMU's ACT code is 2038; the SAT Code is 1560.**

NMU will accept either the ACT or SAT results and will always consider the highest ACT composite or SAT total score from a single test date for admission and scholarship purposes if a student submits multiple test results. Writing scores are not required or considered.

### **YOU DO NOT HAVE TO SUBMIT TEST SCORES IF YOU ARE A:**

Student who has 12 or more college-level credits taken after high school; a non-Canadian international student; high school graduate who completed high school at least three years prior to the semester of intended enrollment; an applicant to some certificate and associate degree programs (see Academic Programs list on the back of this page). Students applying for an education major should submit test scores regardless of exemption.

**Home-Schooled Applicants.** Students who have been home schooled at any time during grades 9-12, and have not taken 12 or more college-level credits after completion of high school, should submit their ACT/SAT results and an official and notarized transcript of courses taken and grades earned while home schooled.
