## Article I

### Agreement on Principle

Northern Michigan University (NMU) and Macomb Community College agree that students, who choose to transfer from a community college to a senior college or university to earn a bachelor's degree, should be provided with a smooth curriculum transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework. Therefore, Northern Michigan University and Macomb Community College agree to enter into this curriculum articulation agreement for students who complete the Associates Degree in Speech Communication Arts: Intercultural/Interpersonal Communication at Macomb Community College and transfer to NMU to complete the B.S. Degree in Communication Studies. Both institutions enter into this agreement as cooperating, equal partners who shall maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

## Article II

### Agreement on Program Specifics

Northern Michigan University (NMU) and Macomb Community College agree that any student who has successfully completed the minimum requirements outlined on the attached articulation guide may transfer the course credits indicated toward the B.S. Degree in Communication Studies at Northern Michigan University. Students who follow this articulated program agreement must apply and be admitted to Northern Michigan University. Macomb Community College students will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission and financial aid. The bachelor's degree graduation requirements for students who follow this articulated program agreement are listed on the attached articulation guide.

## Article III

### Agreement on Communication

Northern Michigan University (NMU) and Macomb Community College agree to cooperate in communication with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. Communication may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit personally or professionally from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff at both institutions will share the information in this agreement with interested and qualified students and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to students and prospective students.

## Article IV

### Agreement on Maintenance and Review Procedures

At least one administrative member from each institution will be appointed to act as agents for the implementation of this agreement, to speak for the institutions and to communicate changes to respective faculty members, advisors, counselors, and others to whom the information is pertinent. Responsibility for oversight of this agreement rests with the Director of University Relations at Macomb Community College and the Associate Provost for Academic Affairs at Northern Michigan University.

Both parties agree to communicate annually any changes in their respective programs that may affect this articulation agreement. During the third year, both parties will review the agreement for revision and

possible renewal. If the agreement is not renewed by the end of the effective agreement, Macomb Community College students who started the articulated program prior to termination of the agreement, will be given three additional years to be admitted to NMU under terms of this agreement.

This agreement is in effect from October 1, 2014 to September 30, 2017. *Note: Students, who began Macomb Community College's Associates Degree in Speech Communication Arts: Intercultural/Interpersonal Communication prior to the effective date of this agreement, may use the agreement to the extent that the program requirements followed are consistent with this agreement.*

Effective Dates of this Articulation Agreement: October 1, 2014 to September 30, 2017

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## Introduction:

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to provide a smooth transition for students who want to earn an associate degree in Speech Communication Arts: Intercultural/Interpersonal Communication at Macomb Community College prior to a transfer to Northern Michigan University to complete a B.S. Degree in Communication Studies. As displayed in this document, the first and second years of coursework are completed at Macomb Community College and third and fourth years at NMU.

## Effective Dates:

The effective dates of this agreement are from October 1, 2014 to September 30, 2017. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who have already started this articulated program at Macomb Community College will be given three additional years to be admitted to NMU under the terms of this agreement. Students, who began the program prior to the effective date, may use the agreement to the extent that the requirements completed are consistent with this agreement.

## First and Second Years at Macomb Community College:

The first and second years of NMU's B. S. Degree in Communication Studies is Macomb Community College's A. A. S. Degree in Speech Communication Arts: Intercultural/Interpersonal Communication. Although it includes up to 72 credit hours, only a maximum of 64 semester credits and an additional 4 semester credits in physical education (health promotion) activity courses may transfer to NMU from a two-year college. Unless otherwise designated, a grade of C- or higher is required for transfer to NMU. The following section displays Macomb Community College's Associates degree with restricted selections to meet requirements within NMU's Liberal Studies Program.

**Note Regarding Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA):** Students who transfer to Northern Michigan University from a Michigan community college and who have Michigan Transfer Agreement Satisfied posted on their transcript will be considered to have met the requirements of NMU's Liberal Studies/General Education program. Students will still be expected to complete all other degree requirements, including graduation requirements (world cultures, health promotions, and lab) and any courses listed as "Other Required Courses" that may also be Liberal Studies/General Education courses. Degree requirements can be found at [www.nmu.edu/catalog](http://www.nmu.edu/catalog). Transfer students who do not complete the

entire block of courses required by the MTA will receive credit for courses they do complete on the basis of individual evaluation and established transfer equivalencies.

### Arts and Sciences Courses at Macomb Community College

Students wishing to obtain an A. A. S. Degree in Speech Communication Arts: Intercultural/Interpersonal Communication must complete a minimum of 18 semester hours of Arts and Sciences courses. Students may select any of the following courses yet should pay close attention to those that are required in the Intercultural/Interpersonal Communication track at Macomb Community College:

2. At least one course in the Liberal Studies Program must be at the **300-level or above**. This requirement can be fulfilled by completing one of the following courses while at MCC: ENGL 2710, ENGL 2720, ENGL 2730, ENGL 2800, ENGL 2810, or GEOG 2000.

NOTE: a maximum of 64 credits (plus 4 PHED credits) may be transferred to NMU as counting toward the B. S. Degree in Communication Studies. Students are advised to consult with their advisor at MCC and the Department of Communication and Performance Studies at NMU to determine which credits should count toward the allowable maximum to be transferred.

## Third and Fourth Years at NMU for a B.S. Degree in Communication Studies

The third and fourth years of NMU's B.S. Degree in Communication Studies is comprised of at least 24 credits of major courses and up to 33 additional credits to reach a minimum of 57 credits. To qualify for a bachelor's degree at NMU, students must meet all graduation requirements, which include the courses listed below, complete at least 32 credits at NMU, 8 credits of which must be included in the major and 4 credits in the minor.

### Additional Graduation Requirements:

1. At least 8 credit hours of a major must be earned at NMU;
2. A "C-" grade or higher is required for all courses within the major, and a 2.5 overall GPA in the major;
3. At least 4 credit hours of a minor must be earned at NMU;
4. A total of 124 credit hours are required for the Degree in Communication Studies;
5. The Liberal Studies Program completed by the student must fulfill the 300-level requirement, World Cultures requirement, and Laboratory Science requirement; and
6. Complete the Health Promotion requirement, which includes HP 200 and an HP activity course;
7. At least 32 credit hours must be earned at NMU.

### Notes to Students:

1. Complete the articulated program as indicated in this articulation guide. Any course substitutions should only be made with the guidance of an advisor or counselor to assure that all requirements are met;
2. Students are encouraged to meet with the B.S. Degree in Communication Studies coordinator at NMU early, before completing an admission application to NMU; and

3. A copy of the articulation agreement should be brought to all advising sessions. Copies of this agreement are available at the Articulation and Transfer Department at Macomb Community College.
