Article I

Agreement on Principle

Northern Michigan University (NMU) and Bay de Noc Community College (Bay College) agree that students, who choose to transfer from a community college to a senior college or university to earn a bachelor's degree, should be provided with a smooth curriculum transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework. Therefore, Northern Michigan University and Bay de Noc Community College agree to enter into this curriculum articulation agreement for students who complete the Associate in Arts Network Administration at Bay College and transfer to NMU to complete the Bachelor of Science Mobile and Web App Development degree. Both institutions enter into this agreement as cooperating, equal partners who shall maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

Article II

Agreement on Program Specifics

NMU and Bay College agree that any student who has successfully completed the minimum requirements outlined on the attached articulation guide may transfer the course credits indicated toward the baccalaureate degree at NMU. Students who follow this articulated program agreement must apply and be admitted to NMU. Bay College students will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission and financial aid. The bachelor's degree graduation requirements for students who follow this articulated program agreement are listed on the attached articulation guide.

Article III

Agreement on Communication

NMU and Bay College agree to cooperate in communication with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. Communication may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit personally or professionally from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff at both institutions will share the information in this agreement with interested and qualified students and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to students and prospective students.

Article IV

Agreement on Maintenance and Review Procedures

At least one administrative member from each institution will be appointed to act as agents for the implementation of this agreement, to speak for the institutions and to communicate changes to respective faculty members, advisors, counselors, and others to whom the information is pertinent. Responsibility for oversight of this agreement rests with the Dean of Business and Technology at Bay de Noc Community College and the Mathematics and Computer Science Head at Northern Michigan University.

Both parties agree to communicate annually any changes in their respective programs that may affect this articulation agreement. During the third year, both parties will review the agreement for revision and possible renewal. If the agreement is not renewed by the end of the effective agreement, Bay de Noc Community College students who started the articulated program prior to termination of the agreement, will be given three additional years to be admitted to NMU under terms of this agreement.

This agreement is in effect from 1 August 2015 until 1 August 2018. Note: Students, who began Bay College AA Network Administration prior to the effective date of this agreement, may use the agreement to the extent that the program requirements followed are consistent with this agreement.

Introduction:

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to provide a smooth transition for students who want to earn an Associate in Art in Network Administration degree at Bay de Noc Community College (Bay College) prior to a transfer to Northern Michigan University (NMU) to complete a Bachelor of Science degree in Mobile and Web Application Development. As displayed in this document, the first and second years of coursework are completed at Bay de Noc Community College and third and fourth years at NMU.

This major is designed to offer students an education in the important world of Internet and network programming. This course of study emphasizes programming skills while concentrating on the latest concepts, architectures, and algorithms for network computation. Students will learn the fundamentals of Computer Science while focusing on aspects most important to the world of Mobile and Web Application Development. Graduates should be well prepared to design the next generation of network application architectures.

Effective Dates:

The effective dates of this agreement are from 1 August 2015 to 1 August 2018. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who have already started this articulated program at Bay College will be given three additional years to be admitted to NMU under the terms of this agreement. Students, who began the program prior to the effective date, may use the agreement to the extent that the requirements completed are consistent with this agreement.

Transfer Credit:

Typically, Bay College students complete the first and second years of this degree at Bay College. The third and fourth years are taken at NMU. A maximum of 64 semester credits, and an additional four (4) semester credits in physical education (health promotion) activity courses may transfer to NMU from a two-year college. Unless otherwise designated, a grade of C- or higher is required for transfer to NMU. The following section displays courses taken by students from Bay College and at NMU. This list is not exclusive, other courses, particularly liberal studies courses, may also be transferred.

Additional Graduation Requirements:

- 1. At least 32 credit hours of a major must be earned at NMU;
- 2. A minor must be declared.
- 3. A "C" grade or higher is required for all courses within major;
- 4. At least 4 credit hours of a minor must be earned at NMU;
- 5. No more than 64 credits plus and additional 4 credits of PE can be transfered into NMU.

Notes to Students:

1. Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA): Students should complete the requirements of the Michigan Transfer Agreement. Students who successfully complete the MTA, certified on the Bay transcript, will be considered to have met the requirements of NMU's Liberal Studies/General Education program. Students will still be expected to complete all other degree requirements, including graduation requirements (English writing competency, math competency, world cultures, health promotions, and lab) and any courses listed as "Other Required Courses" that may also be Liberal Studies/General Education
