Article I Agreement on Principle

Northern Michigan University (NMU) and Oakton Community College agree that students who choose to transfer from a community college to a senior college or university to earn a bachelor's degree should be provided with a smooth curriculum transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework. Therefore, Northern Michigan University and Oakton Community College agree to enter into this curriculum articulation agreement for students who complete the A.G.S.. with Cannabis Dispensary and Patient Care Specialist Certificate at Oakton College and transfer to NMU to complete the Bachelors of Science in Medicinal Plant Chemistry (Entrepreneurial track). Both institutions enter into this agreement as cooperating, equal partners who shall maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

Article II Agreement on Program Specifics

Northern Michigan University (NMU) and Oakton Community College agree that any student who has successfully completed the minimum requirements outlined on the attached articulation guide may transfer the course credits indicated toward the <u>Bachelors of Science in Medicinal Plant Chemistry (Entrepreneurial Track)</u> at Northern Michigan University. Students who follow this articulated program agreement must apply and be admitted to Northern Michigan University. <u>Oakton Community College</u> students will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission and financial aid. The bachelor's degree graduation requirements for students who follow this articulated program agreement are listed on the attached articulation guide.

Article III Agreement on Communication

Northern Michigan University (NMU) and Oakton Community College agree to cooperate in communication with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. Communication may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit personally or professionally from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff at both institutions will share the information in this agreement with interested and qualified students and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to students and prospective students.

Article IV Agreement on Maintenance and Review Procedures

At least one administrative or faculty member from each institution will be appointed to act as agents for the implementation of this agreement, to speak for the institutions and to communicate changes to respective faculty members, advisors, counselors, and others to whom the information is pertinent. Responsibility for oversight of this agreement rests with the <u>Assistant Vice President of Academic Affairs and College Transitions</u> at <u>Oakton Community College</u> and the Associate Provost for Academic Affairs at Northern Michigan University

Both parties agree to communicate annually any changes in their respective programs that may affect this articulation agreement. During the third year, both parties will review the agreement for revision and possible renewal. If the agreement is not reviewed by the end of the effective agreement, <u>Oakton Community College</u> students who started the articulated program prior to termination of the agreement, will be given three additional years to be admitted to NMU under terms of this agreement.

Effective Dates of this Articulation Agreement November 1, 2019 - August 1, 2022

Introduction:

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to provide a smooth transition for students who want to earn an A.G.S.. degree with Cannabis Dispensary and Patient Care Specialist Certificate at Oakton Community College prior to a transfer to Northern Michigan University to complete a B.S. degree in Medicinal Plant Chemistry (Entrepreneurial track). As displayed in this document, the first and second years of coursework are completed at Oakton and third and fourth years at NMU.

The medicinal plant chemistry degree is a technical program focused on plant biology and analytical and organic chemistry as they related to the use of plant extracts for health purposes. The entrepreneurial track combines the science core with business courses to help prepare students for a range of careers in the medicinal plant chemistry industry

Effective Dates:

The effective dates of this agreement are from November 1, 2019 to August 1, 2022. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who have already started this articulated program at Oakton Community College will be given three additional years to be admitted to NMU under the terms of this agreement. Students, who began the program prior to the effective date, may use the agreement to the extent that the requirements completed are consistent with this agreement.

First and Second Years at Oakton Community College

The first and second years of NMU's <u>Medicinal Plant Chemistry –Entrepreneurial Track</u>, B.S. degree is , A.G.S.. degree. A maximum of 90 semester credits may transfer to NMU from a two-year college. Unless otherwise designated, a grade of C- or higher is required for transfer to NMU.
