PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT

To receive credit, students must attend at least two full days of TEAC meetings and its classes or participate in online dialogue. Final grades will be “satisfactory/unsatisfactory” based upon documented evidence of successfully completing the topics associated with the supervision of the student teaching experience. Topics will be determined using TEAC discussions and information from the cooperating teacher reports.
