

Dr. Judith (Judy) Puncochar is a professor of Educational Psychology at Northern Michigan University (NMU). She teaches teacher candidates and professional preK-16 educators in the School of Education, Leadership, and Public Education. Previously, she taught K-12 science, art, and P.E. Dr. Puncochar obtained her doctorate in Educational Psychology from the University of Minnesota in 1996, where she served for 14 years as Interim Director of the Human Relations Program. She joined the Northern faculty in 2004. She teaches educational psychology, research methods, assessment and evaluation, and grant writing. She has been co-principle investigator or contributing author to more than two million US dollars in educational grants, mainly for science and mathematics K-12 education. She co-authored *Empowering Higher Education in Indonesia*, which posits an expansion of General Education / Liberal Arts coursework in Indonesian undergraduate education. She currently serves as Assessment Coordinator for NMU, president of the American Association of University Women–Marquette Branch, and a peer corps reviewer for the Higher Learning Commission.
