d. EPC's role with respect to Extended Learning

L. Putman talked with Steve VandenAvond and asked if there are any programs in the works that he will be hiring faculty for. He said no. She will make sure Extended Learning positions come to EPC. He is currently funding a Clinical Science position for two years and then Academic Affairs will fund after two years. Part of the reason he doesn't fund longer than that is he wants to see on how enrollment grows. New programs should be looked at and if benchmarks aren't met, they are supposed to have an exit plan.

e. Modality of classes: online courses required for programs that are not advertised as hybrid Discussion on online courses required for programs that are not advertised as hybrid. Concerned that programs are being advertised as on campus programs then students find out that one or more of courses needs to be taken online. Some feel students are unaware of the \$50/credit fee. Is this an EPC issue? Should there be a policy? Departments are not reporting this as a problem. B. Canfield will have data at the next meeting.
