Graduate Enrollment 10th Day Snap Data





GA Distribution



Who are our students?

- Majority low-income and firstgeneration
 - 90% solely low-income
 - 83% low-income and first-generation
 - 24% classified as low-income, firstgeneration, and underrepresented ethnic minority groups.

History of Program

- Research program since 1995
- Grown from 5 fellows to now 20-30
- More students could participate if there were more faculty mentors available

 - More research activity offers room for more external funding






