*Subject to Change. Rates are established annually each summer by the NMU Board of Trustees and may change in future academic years.

NMU operates under a "flat-rate" tuition plan, meaning students can enroll in 12 to 16 credits per semester for one rate. Fewer or more credits (1-11 or 17+ credits) are charged at a per-credit rate.

MICHIGAN RESIDENTS

Lower Division (1-55 credits)

- ▶ \$5,085 per semester, flat rate (12-16 credits)
- ▶ \$397 per credit (1-11 or 17+ credits)

Upper Division (56+ credits)

- ▶ \$5,343 per semester, flat rate
- ▶ \$418.50 per credit

NON-MICHIGAN RESIDENTS

Lower Division (1-55 credits)

- ▶ \$7,833 per semester, flat rate
- ▶ \$626 per credit

Upper Division (56+ credits)

- ▶ \$8,217 per semester, flat rate
- ▶ \$658 per credit

OFF-CAMPUS AND WEB COURSES

(same rates for Michigan and non-Michigan residents)

- ▶ Lower Division: \$397 per credit
- ▶ Upper Division: \$418.50 per credit
- ▶ Distance Education Fee: \$50 per credit

STANDARD FEES: Not included in annual cost example below.

- ▶ **Recreation Pass:** \$79 per semester (refundable through 5th day of semester)
- ▶ **Athletic Fee:** \$250 (one time fee)
- ▶ **Art & Design Technology Fee:** \$250/semester (Fee for MacBook, Art & Design students only)

EXAMPLE ANNUAL COST FOR 2017-18

Here is an example for a lower-division student enrolled full time for the academic year (two semesters), living in a Quad I or Quad II residence hall with a roommate, on the gold constant meal plan.

\$15,736 Tuition and Fees

- NMU offers one of the lowest combined tuition and room and board rates among state institutions in Michigan.
- Nearly 89 percent of undergraduate Northern students receive some type of financial assistance.
- NMU undergrad students received over \$78 million from all sources of financial aid in 2016-2017.
- On average, NMU students receive \$12,275 in financial aid per year from all sources (grants, scholarships and loans).
