* Requires stated cumulative college GPA in 12 or more college level-credits after high school graduation.

RENEWAL ELIGIBILITY

- Freshmen may receive scholarships for up to 8 semesters, until completion of first bachelor’s degree.
- Transfers may receive scholarships for up to 6 semesters, until completion of first bachelor’s degree.
- Must maintain a minimum cumulative 3.0 NMU GPA and full-time enrollment, except as noted.
- Must meet satisfactory academic progress policy requirements.

OTHER AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIPS

- **Freshman Fellowship** \$1,000 in earnings working with faculty on research projects during freshman year.
- **Talent Recognition Awards** Amounts awarded vary for awards in art/design, music and theater.
- **NMU Foundation Donor-Funded Scholarships** The award amounts, criteria and availability for these donor-gifted scholarships vary.
- **Alumni Dependent Tuition Program** (for non-Michigan residents) and **Alumni Legacy Scholarships**.
- **Veterans or those currently serving in the United States Armed Forces**, and their covered individuals, receive resident-equivalent tuition rates.
- **PTK Award \$500/yr** For Phi Theta Kappa members transferring directly to NMU from a two year college.
- **ROTC Scholarships** For information go to nmu.edu/ROTC.

TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

Paying for your college education is likely a concern for both you and your family. At Northern, we are committed to providing you with a quality education at a reasonable cost. We encourage all students to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

NMU operates under a “flat-rate” tuition plan, meaning students can enroll in 12 to 18 credits per semester for one rate.* For students living on campus, room and board rates shown below include a double-occupancy room, the “gold constant meal plan”, unlimited use of residence hall laundry facilities, activity programming, and in-room local phone service, cable TV and Internet.

EXAMPLE ANNUAL COST

Here is an example for a student enrolled full time for the academic year (two semesters), living in a residence hall with a roommate, on the constant meal plan.

*Tuition and fees include the use of a notebook computer for all full-time students (12 credits or more a semester). MacBooks are provided for students majoring in Art and Design, which cost an additional \$250 per semester (\$500 per year) for the higher cost of the MacBook and its related software. Each new student pays a one-time student athletic fee of \$240 for admission to all varsity events, which covers the entire period of enrollment until graduation.

- NMU offers one of the lowest combined tuition and room and board rates among state institutions in Michigan.
- Nearly 88 percent of Northern students receive some type of financial assistance.
- NMU students received over \$84 million from all sources of financial aid last year, in 2014-2015.
- On average, NMU students receive more than \$11,800 in financial aid per year from all sources (grants, scholarships and loans).
