In contrast, the thing I feel should change is the availability of "future planning resources." Our advisors are professors first, advisors second, and that's fine. That's what I want in my professors. But some of them don't know how to help us plan. They don't know what post-undergraduate programs are best suited for our needs and interests. They don't know the process we have to go through to be admitted as well as someone dedicated to the task may be. I didn't understand what the GRE was or why it was important for a longer time than I'd care to admit. I still don't understand how to pursue research opportunities outside of being notified about one or asking professors. There are research programs at other universities that accept non-resident students, and I have to pursue those in order to get that research experience that will put me over the top in getting into grad schools. We have a writing lab, we have ACAC, but I didn't find out that they can help in these regards until later than many of my peers, because I was not advised so. What I want to change is an emphasis in preparing students for their future, whatever that may be. We have a pre-professional advisor that oversees a large amount of students of varying backgrounds, varying needs, varying goals. That's a tough thing, but for many of those different preprofessional programs, they have similar requisites and expectations of applicants. But for graduate programs, I don't have a designated person that I know to go ask about just graduate school. I have my advisor for my major, but that's it. That person may exist and I don't know, and that's an issue in itself. We need to understand, by reaching out and asking on a more regular basis, what our students' goals are and how best to help them achieve those goals.
